

BROKEN STRIPE SWEATER



Aran

Knitting Needs

Black Hills Corilana natural coloured dye free 100% wool

Small - 200g - 2-4 yrs

Large - 300g - 4-6 yrs

100g contrast

(Yarn amounts given are approximate and are based on average requirements.)

1 pair 4.00mm needles

1 pair 5.00mm needles

Wool needle to sew up garment

Stitch holders x 2

Row markers

Tension

16 sts and 22 rows to 10cm (4ins) (stocking stitch) on 5.00mm needles or size needed to achieve stated tension.

Experience Level



= intermediate

There are 2 collar options

- a) Round
- b) Shawl collar (requires a "V" neck)

BACK

*Using 4.00mm needles cast on 57 (75) sts

Rib (k1, P1) for 12 (16) rows

Change to 5.00mm needles.

Row 1 : Using main colour (m c) and contrast colour (c c) work in ss :

3sts purl c c, 1 sts plain (m c)

Row 2 : reverse row 1 : so the 1 purl stitch is knitted plain in m c and the 3 purl stitches are knitted plain in c c.

Weave the wool in at the back.

Rows 3 – 6 : st st in m c

These 6 rows form the broken stripe

Work in pattern until work measures 31 (38)cm [12 (15) ins] or required length to armhole ending with a WS row

Place markers for armhole**

Continue for a further 14 (18)cm [5½ (7) ins] ending with a WS row

Leave sts on stitch holder.

FRONT

Round Neck

Work the same as back from * to **

Pattern a further 9cm (3½ ins) ending with a WS row.

Shape for neck:

Row 1 : K33 (42), put on stitch holder and work on remaining 24 (32) sts, work to end

Row 2 : Purl (and alternate row)

Dec 1 st at neck edge on next 4 rows until 20(28) sts, then on next alternate row (twice) 18(26) sts

Continue until work measures same as back, leave these sts on a stitch holder.

With WS of work facing, place 9 sts on a stitch holder (centre front), work to end.

Work as for first half of neck shaping reversing decreasings.

SLEEVES

Using 4.00mm needles cast on 30 (38)sts.

Rib for 12 rows

Change to 5.00mm needles and keeping continuity of pattern, work 4 rows

Inc 1 st at the beginning of each end of next and following 6th row until 36 (44)sts, then

Inc each end of following 4th row until 50 (58)sts

Continue until sleeve measures 27 (33)cm [10½ (13) ins] (or required length)

Cast off loosely

TO MAKE UP

Sew up one shoulder seam Work neckband as instructions from ♣ to ♣♣

Sew up other shoulder seam and neckband.

Leaving side seams open, set in sleeves and sew to shoulder seams

Sew up side seams and sleeve seams

NECK BAND

♣With RS front facing, pick up 16sts up neck edge, 21sts from stitch holder at back neck, 16sts down other neck edge and finally, 10sts from centre front holder 63sts.

Rib 16 rows

Cast off loosely

Fold neck band in half inside jumper and slip stitch band. ♣♣

V-NECK

Work the same as back from * to ** to armhole length, put in marker.

Next row : work 26 (33) sts, turn

Continue on these stitches decreasing 1 sts at neck edge on every following alt row 4 (5) times.

Then, every following 4th row, 6 (7) times.

Cast off loosely.

Join yarn to remaining sts and K2 tog at neck edge, reverse shaping as for first side to form the “V”.

Shawl Collar

(knitted separately)

Using 4.00mm needles, cast on 106 (126) sts.

Work in K1, P1 rib 4 (5) cm [1½ (2) ins] from beginning ending with a WS row.

Cast off 5 sts at beginning of next 14 (18) rows.

Cast off remaining 36 (36) sts very loosely in rib.

Attach shaped side of shawl collar to “V” neck
